

As many of you know, I was raised in a Pastor's home. The church was the center of my social life; I felt loved and accepted by this extended "family." That big body of believers provided an unshakable foundation of values and understanding, which I still hold firmly.

However, times have changed. We as families find ourselves in a juggling act trying to balance career, church, and family, which can be a constant struggle. It is rarely possible to realign priorities once and for all. An imbalance can occur in a matter of days. The moment we take a family "breather" and relax, we then tend to turn right around to say "yes" a few times when we should have said "no"—and suddenly we're overworked again.

You know, it's not been so long ago that the church was the place families came together to seek community in times of joy and in times of much needed help. So what has happened? When did this shift begin where the welcoming arms of the church family no longer extend past our own pew? I'm concerned about the number of families that come through our church doors each year and give us only fleeting opportunity to introduce them to Jesus Christ. Typically, it's not our theology that brings them to our door. Usually their minds are racing with questions like: Am I needed here? Will I be accepted? Will they include me and my family? Could this be the place where we will fit in and find friends and fellowship?

People are desperate for a sense of community for themselves and their family. Eventually many of these lonely people search for fellowship in a church setting. But what happens when they arrive at our sanctuary?

As we think about the Western church in an age of rising secularism, we often cast our gaze outward, as we should, toward those "out there" who are leaving the faith and departing the Body. But we also need to cast our gaze inward toward our own church members who have felt a lack of community, understanding that discipleship and evangelism begin right here, in mundane routines and familiar spaces. So as we continue reflecting on the need for community to once again be ever so weaved in and throughout our church family, may we be challenged to reflect on the idea that the greatest contribution the church can make is to be imitators of Jesus Christ and reflect His love through intentional relationships. Nothing brings people together more effectively than a face-to-face encounter with the Creator of community. The Great Commission starts in our own backyard. For Campbellsville Christian Church, our most important mission field is closer than we think.
